

**Block 3: Four X - Jo Morton**

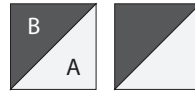
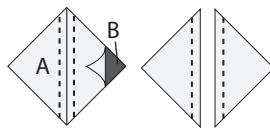
Use (1) light and (1) dark fabric. Fabrics are listed in order of use.

- A - (2) squares, 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" (LIGHT)
- B - (2) squares, 2 7/8" x 2 7/8" (DARK)
- C - (2) squares, 3 1/4" x 3 1/4" (LIGHT)
- D - (2) squares, 3 1/4" x 3 1/4" (DARK)
- E - (1) square, 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" (DARK)

4. Lay out Unit #1's, Unit #2's, and E square, as shown. Sew into rows; press rows in opposite directions. Sew rows together (press seam open) to create the Four X block measuring 6 1/2" square.

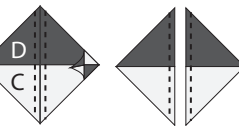
**Assembly**

1. Draw a diagonal line, corner to corner, on the wrong side of (1) A square and place on (1) B square; pin in place. Stitch a 1/4" seam allowance on each side of drawn line. Cut in half and press pieced squares toward B. Make (4) Unit #1.



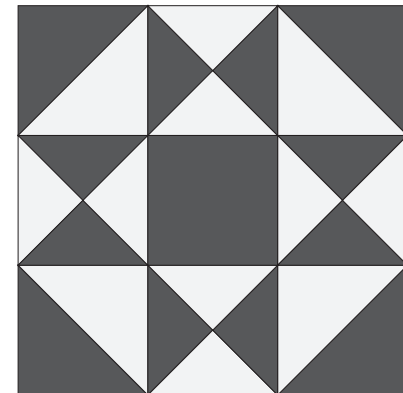
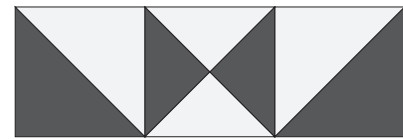
Unit #1's

2. Repeat Step 1 using (2) D squares and (2) C squares. Make (4) D/C pieced squares.



Unit #2's

3. Draw a diagonal line, corner to corner, on the wrong side of (1) pieced square from Step 2 and place on second pieced square with right sides together and opposite fabrics facing. Sew a 1/4" seam allowance on each side of drawn line. Cut in half and press seams open. Make (4) Unit #2.
